Gondwana Indigenous Children's Choir

Lyn Williams AM, Artistic Director
Lauren Hanney, Co-Conductor & Piano
Stephanie Grenning, Conductor, Cairns Gondwana Indigenous Singers

Based in Cairns, Queensland, the Gondwana Indigenous Children's Choir and their 'big sisters' Marliya are the most powerful and well-recognised group of young Indigenous performers in the country. Under the leadership of Lyn Williams AM and Lauren Hannay, the rich, vibrant sound of the choir warms the hearts of audiences whenever it performs. The choir has a strong commitment to commissioning new choral music incorporating First Nations language and story, in collaboration with cultural custodians. Films of the choir singing these pieces on Country have shared this work to a wider audience, including Birinyi (2020), a Yidinji story shared by Gudju Gudju with music by Luke Byrne and Buda:dji (2021), a Djabugay story shared by Dennis Hunter with music by Dan Walker. Most recently, the choir filmed Buruwan Elergy, a piece composed to commemorate 200th Anniversary of the Appin Massacre, with text by Jodi Edwards and music by Luke Byrne. The choir has performed with First Nations artists including Gurrumul, Archie Roach, Uncle Seaman Dan and Jessica Mauboy and at major events such as the G20 Summit, and the NAIDOC Gala Ball. The choir has collaborated several times with the Australian Chamber Orchestra Collective. In 2017, the Gondwana Indigenous Children's Choir undertook its first European tour, including a collaboration with the Vienna Boys' Choir called Songs of My Country. In July 2022, they gave the premiere performance of William Barton's Of the Earth with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra and Simone Young for the reopening of the Sydney Opera House Concert Hall.

ARTISTS

Lyn Williams AM

Artistic Director, Gondwana Choirs

Lyn Williams is widely regarded as one of the finest conductors of choirs around the world. For over 30 years, Lyn has harnessed the incredible power of young voices through her world-renowned ensembles: the Sydney Children's Choir, Gondwana Voices, the Gondwana Indigenous Children's Choir and Marliya. Her choirs have appeared with the world's leading orchestras and conductors and at festivals including the BBC Proms and Polyfollia. Lyn has commissioned over 200 works from composers across Australia and around the world and her ability to forge innovative and meaningful collaborations is widely recognised. She continues to foster strong relationships with First Nations artists across Australia, bringing together cultural custodians and composers to create new works which preserve and celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island languages and cultures. Lyn enjoys a longstanding collaboration with singer-songwriter Felix Riebl of the Cat Empire and the singers of Marliya, presenting the critically-acclaimed show Spinifex Gum, which has featured at almost every Australian arts festival since its premiere at the Adelaide Festival in 2018. In 2017, Lyn received the Australia Council for the Arts' Don Banks Music Award for outstanding and sustained contribution to music in Australia, in recognition of her lifework as founder and director of Gondwana Choirs.

Lauren Hannay

Piano & Co-Conductor, Gondwana Indigenous Children's Choir
Cairns-based Lauren Hannay is a graduate of University of Queensland with double principal studies of Voice and Piano. She completed a Post-Graduate diploma at Queensland Conservatorium of Music in Vocal performance working with acclaimed singing teacher Margaret Nickson. Her particular expertise lies in the integration of sound vocal technique in the choral context. Lauren has had a long association with Gondwana Choirs, where she is the pianist and co-conductor of Cairns-based Gondwana Indigenous Children's Choir. In October 2019 she conducted the choir with ACO Collective at CPAC. Lauren has toured nationally with GICC and on their first international tour to Germany, Slovenia and Vienna. She has presented for ANCA QLD and National Choral School's 'Choral Ideas Symposium' in 2018 and 2019 and again for the Gondwana World Choral Festival: Music and Ideas series. In 2020, she was associate conductor and pianist for Gondwana Collective with Lyn Williams AM preparing for the New Zealand World Choral Symposium.



Young Voices of Melbourne

Mark O'Leary OAM, Artistic Director

Young Voices of Melbourne was founded by Mark O'Leary OAM in 1990, and is now regarded as one of Australia's finest young choirs, admired for its passionate performances, interesting repertoire and outstanding Kodály based music education program. On our Queensland tour YVM will be conducted by Mark O'Leary, Juliana Kay and Amelia Alder. Also joining us on tour are hammer dulcimer player Malcolm Dalglish, pianist Julia Piggin and percussionist Peter Jacob.

Singers in our organisation aged 6 to 30 years rehearse weekly in one of six choirs. The touring choir consists of singers aged 11 – 17 years. YVM performs regularly in and around Melbourne, and has taken its music to all states and territories of Australia, as well as Europe, the UK, South Africa, Canada, the USA, Singapore, Thailand, Samoa, New Zealand and Japan. On its travels the choir has performed at many international choral festivals, has been successful in competitions in Asia and Europe, and has performed with many leading choirs. Young Voices of Melbourne has released twelve CD recordings and is regularly heard on Australian radio and television.

ARTISTS

Mark O'Leary OAM

Artistic Director, Young Voices of Melbourne

Mark O'Leary has worked with choirs of all ages for nearly 40 years. He is the Director of Young Voices of Melbourne which he founded in 1990 and has been Gondwana Voices' Principal Guest Conductor since its first season in 1997. He has been on more than 45 national and international tours and has made 18 CD recordings with Young Voices of Melbourne, Gondwana Voices and Exaudi. He publishes choral music for young singers in the YVM Choral Series and is the creator of the Sight Singing School website and books, used in more than 50 countries. He is a Churchill Fellow, an Honorary Life Member of Kodály Australia and was awarded an OAM for services to choral music in 2018.

Malcolm Dalglish

Guest Artist

Malcolm Dalglish graduated from National Outdoor Leadership School in his teen years, then failed to graduate from Oberlin College, where he was in residence with an experimental theater troupe, and Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, where he studied music education. Instead, he built and then became a master of the hammered dulcimer, founded the popular folk music trio Metamora, recorded 15 albums with labels such as Windham Hill, Rounder, and Times Music of India, and has become a prolific composer of vocal music that comes alive at his off-the-grid performance camp near Yosemite and with the lively and masterful youth choirs of Australian conductor Mark O'Leary. His music is inspired by the outdoors and the writings of Wendell Berry and others.

Juliana Kay

Conductor

Juliana Kay is a Melbourne-based conductor, composer and teacher with a deep-rooted love for choirs and choral music. Juliana is the Director of Exaudi youth choir, Assistant Conductor of Young Voices of Melbourne and Head of Choral at St Catherine's School. In 2018 she also founded innovative chamber choir Choral Edge, which sees her regularly experimenting with multimedia performances and theatre collaborations. Her compositions are performed regularly by choirs across Australia and are available through the publisher SingScore.

Amelia Alder

Conductor, YVMen, Fiddle

Amelia Alder is an experienced and energetic performer, music educator and vocal director. With a BMus (Hons) in Performance, a Grad.Dip.Ed (Music) and an Australian Kodaly Certificate in Music Education, Amelia has directed vocal groups at numerous schools, universities and organisations and currently works at Caulfield Grammar School and Young Voices of Melbourne. Amelia is also the Founder and Director of Vocal Australia which is dedicated to serving the needs of the Australian a cappella community.

Julia Piggin

Piano

Julia Piggin is a leading Melbourne accompanist and teacher. She has many years experience teaching in Melbourne schools, and has been YVM's principal accompanist since 2000. She is an authority on Kodály teaching techniques, and is currently on the staff of Christ Church Grammar School.

Peter Jacob

Percussion

Peter Jacob studied percussion at the NSW Conservatorium of Music, and on graduation worked extensively with the Sydney, Tasmanian and West Australian Symphony Orchestras. In addition he worked with The Australian Chamber Orchestra and in 1984 toured Australia with the Israel Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Zubin Mehta. From 1994 – 2011 Peter was a member of the World Music group Sirocco which toured widely within Australia and internationally. He has been involved in many contemporary music ensembles such as Synergy Percussion and the Seymour Group, and is the AMEB's chief examiner in percussion and drum set.
